She is the Principal Investigator of the Project [ERC ABIDE – Animal Abidings: Recovering from Disasters in more-than human communities](#) to study how animals recover from disasters, in particular wildfires. Veronica holds a PhD in Social Sciences (Sociology) by ICS-ULisboa and her current research interests are focused on human-animal relationships and the construction of daily practices and bonds between human and non-human animals. Former projects include: “Liminal Becomings: reframing human-animal relations in natural disasters”, on animals in disasters; and “CLAN: Children-Animals’ Friendships: challenging boundaries between humans and non-humans in contemporary societies”, on children and companion animals.

Is a Research Professor in Sociology at the Institute of Social Sciences, University of Lisbon. She is coordinator of the [LIFE research group](#) and director of the journal *Análise Social*. She holds a PhD in Sociology from the ISCTE-IUL and is a lecturer in several doctoral programmes, including the Inter-University Doctoral Programme in Sociology: Knowledge for Open and Inclusive Societies and the PhD Programme in Gender Studies. Her current research focuses on marginalised groups and covers multiple themes, mobilising an intersectional and transnational perspective. She has coordinated the ERC project TRANSRIGHTS: “Gender Citizenship and Sexual Rights in Europe”, comparing the lives of transgender people in five European countries. Sofia is currently leading the FCT-funded project Race Trouble, which uses a qualitative approach to analyze the meanings of racial and ethnic categories and the discrimination experienced by racial minorities and migrants.

Is a Research Fellow at the Institute of Systems and Computer Engineering (INESC-ID). She holds a PhD in Sociology from ISCTE-IUL and has worked on projects related to youth, digital technologies, and public perception of science communication.
